Jupiter Town Council Salutes FJB Volunteers

Mayor Karen Golonka, representing Jupiter's Town Council, presented FJB volunteers with a proclamation at the February beach cleanup that recognized a major milestone. In February, the **cumulative weight of garbage and recyclables removed from the 2 ½ mile stretch of dog-friendly beach by FJB volunteers surpassed the 10,000 pound** mark after only 18 months of tracking weight. HERE'S THE SCOOP ON FRIENDS OF JUPITER BEACH CLEANUPS:

MEET: 8:00am every First Saturday of the Month!

Ocean Cay Park, southeast corner of US Hwy. 1 and Marcinski Road. (North of Donald Ross Rd., South of Indiantown Rd.) Anita Lankler Pavilion (which faces the beach road). *All volunteers must abide by Code of Safety* www.friendsofjupiterbeach.com in "Beach Cleanup" tab.

WHAT HAPPENS: Sign in & get your **free prize ticket**.

Join a team, grab small bags (bring some from home!). Each team cleans a section—on the beach, along walkways, under crossovers, in parking areas, park etc. Empty small bags into SWA Adopt-a-Spot bags (provided). Keep trash in separate bags from recyclables. Follow the direction of your team captain! **Dogs stay home today!**

LEAVE BAGS BY THE TRASHCANS ON THE SIDEWALK;

not on the beach, not on the road. Hurrah! **RAPID REMOVAL** picks up recyclables!
